

DESCRIPTION

This CCA watershed flows into the 'Del Mar Landing' Area of Special Biological Significance (ASBS), which is part of Del Mar Landing State Marine Park, and has 0.6 miles of coastline. The watershed area immediately adjacent to this ASBS is a part of Sea Ranch private community, which has several homes and a walking trail along the coastline. The watershed includes State Highway 1, which is less than ½ mile from the coast.

With the exception of four nonpoint source and storm water conveyances, there are no other sources of pollutants known to drain directly into the ASBS; however, eight ephemeral streams draining into or near the ASBS potentially carry pollutants from upstream sources. Homes in the area have septic systems that may contribute pollutants into the watershed. A golf course is located approximately ½ mile north of the ASBS.
