

DESCRIPTION

This CCA watershed flows into the ‘Bodega’ Area of Special Biological Significance (ASBS) in Sonoma County. This ASBS is 1 mile long and borders a fairly rural part of the Bodega headland. The Bodega Marine Lab is located on the coastline of this ASBS.

This ASBS is part of Bodega State Marine Reserve; there is limited access to the Reserve between Horseshoe Cove and the southern boundary of the Marine Reserve. No NPS pollutants of concern were identified in this watershed.
