

DESCRIPTION

This watershed flows into the 'Southeast Santa Catalina Island' Area of Special Biological Significance (ASBS), which has 2.9 miles of coastline along the east end of the island. There are two direct discharges and three natural streams draining to the ASBS.

The major source of anthropogenic impacts is associated with a large quarry. The surface topography in the quarry area has been altered in such a way that runoff of stormwater, as well as aerial deposition, may occur. It is also possible that dredging may occur at the barge-loading site. This quarry is not currently regulated under a State or Regional NPDES Permit or Waste Discharge Requirements.
